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## Dear Extension Volunteer:

You might find yourself in a situation where you chaperone and/or chauffer youth while serving as a Texas Master Naturalist, i.e., an Extension Volunteer. If you chaperone and/or chauffer youth as an Extension Volunteer, you must be screened through the Youth Protection Standards (YPS) process.

- For those with prior screening (within last three years): Submit the attached YPS volunteer screening form with a letter from your employer/coordinator on organization letterhead documenting the results of your prior screening. No \$10 payment required, or
- 2. For those with no prior screening: Submit the attached YPS volunteer screening form. Include a \$10 check or money order payable to "ANR Committee", and
- 3. Mail the completed form and your \$10 payment to:

Please call or email me with your questions and comments. All information will remain completely confidential. I will compile a list of all Gulf Coast Master Naturalist Volunteers who are willing and eligible to work with youth.

What is the YPS Program?

The YPS program is the tool that Texas Cooperative Extension uses in the application and acceptance of volunteers. This program began more than three years ago and continues to affirm the best practices related to volunteer administration. The purposes of the program include:

- Provide a safe and secure environment for youth and adults;
- Educate Extension employees and volunteers regarding and prevention of abuse;
- Implement the best practices related to the management of volunteer service risk;
   and
- Protect the image and integrity of Texas Cooperative Extension.

The following are program details.

Consistency Among all Extension Volunteer Programs: All Extension Volunteer programs should adhere to the procedures of the Youth Protection Standards program. This program is required for ALL volunteer programs who have the potential of working with youth audiences or who are currently working with youth. The screening process is both a safeguard for volunteers and clientele, youth and adult alike.

Screening Frequency: Volunteer applicants will be re-qualified through the YPS program every three years.

*Prior Screening:* Volunteers will document a prior criminal background check from another entity on the enclosed application. Texas Cooperative Extension will only accept those screenings done by entities on the approved list (below). If a volunteer's screening entity is not an approved source, they must be screened through the YPS process.

Approved Prior Screening Entities

- School Districts
- Churches
- Youth Groups/Associations (Little League, Sports Associations, etc...)
- Youth Agencies/Organizations (e.g., Big Brother/Big Sisters, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.)
- Law Enforcement (County, State or Federal)
- Texas Youth Commission
- Department of Defense Child and Youth Services
- Department of Defense Family Programs

Texas Cooperative Extension is committed to providing a safe environment for our employees and clientele. In doing this, we are also protecting the integrity and image of our agency and system. Extension Volunteer support and implementation of the Youth Protection Standards program are keys to our success in this area.
