CROP NUTRIENT NEEDS

VAMPIRE BATS COULD MOVE INTO TEXAS

Crop fertilization is not an exact science. The soil is a dynamic, changing, and complex mixture of organic matter, minerals, insects, nematodes, bacteria, fungi, water, and gasses. Any change in one or more of these factors can change the availability of nutrients to plants. Much is known about how soils and soil nutrients respond to these changes, but no one can predict precisely which changes will occur. Recommendations for essential plant nutrients are based on "averages" from field and laboratory tests and on what "usually" works best under "normal" conditions. Special circumstances call for specific suggestions.

Vampire bats are mainly found in Mexico and Central and South America, but their habitat has been expanding north into the U.S. over the past few years.

In Mexico, vampire bats cause about \$47 million a year in damages through livestock predation and public health risk concerns. The warm-blooded flying mammals are particularly attracted to cattle.








Managing Small Pasture for Horses



Argentinean Grilled Steak or Chicken with Salsa Criolla

Enjoy a flavorful homemade Argentinean-style Salsa Criolla with your favorite grilled meat! Serves: 4

Ingredients:

For the Salsa Criolla:

- 1 tomato, finely chopped, remove seeds
- 1/2 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion
- 1/4 teaspoon ground oregano
- 2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley
- 1/8 teaspoon low sodium adobo seasoning
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1/8 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 2 teaspoons red wine vinegar

For the meat:

- 1 pound skirt steak or thinly sliced chicken breasts
- 1/8 teaspoon low sodium adobo seasoning

Directions:

- 1. In a small bowl mix all salsa ingredients. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour or up to 48 hours.
- 2. Lightly grease grill grates and turn grill to medium-high heat. Sprinkle adobo seasoning on both sides of the chosen meat. Grill meat until desired color and proper internal temperature is met (beef 145 °F, chicken 165 °F).
- 3. Thinly slice meat and top with Salsa Criolla.
